

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No. 262/D/400

In the Matter of Holme Stinted Pasture, Holme, Cumbria

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registrations at Entry Nos 1 to 7 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No.CL.32 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Cumbria County Council and is occasioned by Objection No. 2/17 made by Brigadier C E Tryon-Wilson and noted in the Register on 1 November 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Kendal on 9 June 1981. The hearing was attended by Mr M Gillibrand, Solicitor, on behalf of Mr E Burrow, the applicant for the registration at Entry No. 5, and by Mr R W Sykes, Solicitor, on behalf of the Objector. There was no appearance by or on behalf of any of the applicants for the other registrations.

Mr Sykes informed the that the only registration in respect of which he was instructed to pursue the objection was that at Entry No 4 and that he was instructed to agree the confirmation of that registration with the numbers of animals reduced from 120 to 20 sheep and from 60 to 5 head of cattle.

In these circumstances I confirm the registrations at Entry Nos. 1 to 3 and 5 to 7, and I confirm the registration at Entry No 4 with the following modifications, namely, the substitution of "20" for 120" and "5" for "60" and the deletion of the unnecessary words " (stated by the applicant to be equivalent to 15 gates:)".

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
