

In the Matter of Bringsty Common, Linton and Whitbourne, Hereford and Worcester (No 7)

## DECISION

This dispute relates to the registration at Entry No 18 in the Rights section of Register Unit No CL 14 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the former Hereford County Council and is occasioned by Objection No 179 made by the former Bromyard Rural District Council and noted in the Register on, 21 October 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Morcester on 30 November 1977. The hearing was attended by Mr H H Roche, Chairman of the Bringsty Common Manorial Court, on behalf of the applicant for the registration and by Mr P Graham, solicitor, on behalf of the Malvern Hills District Council, the successor authority of the Objector.

By agreement of the parties I confirm the registration with the following modifications:- namely the substitution for the words in column 4 of the words :-

- "(a) Right to graze 4 sheep or other animals in accordance with the
- following formula:-
- 4 sheep = 1 donkey
- l sheep = l goat
- Sheep to become adult sheep on 30 September next following their birth
- Right of estovers
- " over the whole of the land comprised in the Register Unit.
- "(b) Right to graze 4 sheep or other animals in accordance with the following
- formula:-
- 11 4 sheep = 1 donkey
- 1 sheep = 1 goat
- Sheep to become adult sheep on 30 September next following their birth
- Right of estovers
- " over the whole of the land comprised in the Register Unit."

and the substitution for the words in column 5 of the words:-

- "(a) The Bungalow, Bringsty, Herefordshire, comprising parcel numbers 55 (pt) and 57 (pt) on the O.S. Map (2nd edition 1904) for the Parish of Linton, Herefordshire.
- The Post Office and Blacksmith's Shop, Bringsty, Herefordshire, comprising parcel numbers 55(pt), 56, 57 (pt), and 66 on the said O.S. Man.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of lar may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
