In the Matter of Broad Green, Broadwas, Martley R.D., Worcestershire

## **DECISION**

This reference relates to the question of the ownership of land known as Broad Green, Broadwas, Martley Rural District being the land comprised in the Land Section of Register Unit No.CL.78 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Worcestershire County Council of which no person is registered under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965 as the owner.

Following upon the public notice of this reference no person claimed to be the freehold owner of the land in question and no person claimed to have information as to its ownership.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the question of the ownership of the land at Worcester on 13 November 1973. At the hearing Broadwas Parish Council were represented by Mr. G. Turner, one of their members.

Mr. Turner who was born in 1910 and has lived in the Village all his life said (in effect):- The Parish Council was formed about 3 years ago and he has been a member since its formation. Broad Green is now overgrown with bushes and rusnes; he remembered that at one time, there was a football pitch for "Sunday morning football", (coats were the goal posts), and goats grazed there. About 20 years ago a neighbour living off Broad Green showed him a printed paper stating that Mr. Bosworth, who in the 1700's owned the Parish (as Squire), had left Broad Green to the householders of that time; shortly afterwards the paper was burnt. The Parish Council could offer no evidence of ownership.

In the absence of any evidence I am not satisfied that any person is the owner of the land and it will therefore be subject to protection under section 9 of the Act of 1965.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
