

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference Nos. 234/D/107-108

In the Matter of Old Chapel Green, Wenhaston, Suffolk (No. 1)

DECISION

These disputes relate to the registration at Entry No. 1 in the Land Section of Register Unit No. VG 44 in the Register of Town or Village Greens maintained by the Suffolk County Council and are occasioned by the conflicting registrations at Entry No. 1 in the Land Section and Entry Nos. 1 and 2 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL 132 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Council.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Ipswich on 20 January 1982. The hearing was attended by Mrs L M Spindler, a member of the Wenhaston Parish Council, the applicant for the registration. There was no appearance by or on behalf of Mr J H Roberts or Mr J R Ellis, the applicants for the conflicting registrations.

Since the registration would have become final but for the conflicting registrations and those registrations have not been supported, I confirm the registration.

The rights the subject of the conflicting registrations will, of course, be transferred to the Rights Section of this Register Unit.

I am recuired by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
