DECISION

These disputes relate to (1) the registration at Entry No. 3 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No. CL 42 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Suffolk County Council occasioned by Objection No. 150 made by Baron de Lancey (2) the registration at Entry No. 2 in the Ownership Section occasioned by Objection No. 148 made by Wortham Parish Council, both noted in the Register on 5 July 1972.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute; at Bury St Edmunds on 25 January 1983. The hearing was attended by Mr J O Davies, Solicitor, appearing on behalf of Baron de Lancey, and by Mr R M W Rmsh, Chairman of Wortham and Burgate Parish Council.

The applicant for registration at Entry No. 3 in the Rights Section was Mr Leonard C Wills and his Solicitors had written confirming an agreement reached between him and the Objector for a modification of the Entry. In accordance with the terms of the agreement I confirm the Entry modified by deleting in Column 4 the word 'Turbary' and the figure '3' and in Column 5 by deleting "2. Rights also held in gross".

Baron de Lancey is the applicant for registration at Entry No. 2 in the Ownership Section. Mr Davies told me that the de Lancey Foundation is his successor and that the ownership claim is based on ownership of the manor of which the Unit land is part. The Parish Council has withdrawn its Objection and in these circumstances I confirm the registration at Entry No. 2 in the Ownership Section.

I am required by regulation 30(1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous <u>in point of law</u> may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
