

COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT 1965

Reference No 236/D/175

In the Matter of Rickford Common, Worplesdon, Surrey

DECISION

This dispute relates to the registrations at Entry Nos 1 to 8 in the Rights Section of Register Unit No.CL.157 in the Register of Common Land maintained by the Surrey County Council and is occasioned by Objections Nos 258 and 365 made by the former Surrey County Council and noted in the Register on 21 September 1970.

I held a hearing for the purpose of inquiring into the dispute at Guildford on 27 April 1979. The hearing was attended by Mr P F Myers, solicitor, on behalf of the Surrey County Council. There was no appearance by or on behalf of any of the applicants for the registrations, but Mr Myers produced documents signed by or on behalf of the applicants for the registrations at Entry Nos 2 to 8 on the basis of which I confirm the registration at Entry No. 2 with the following modifications, namely, the deletion of the words "The right of herbage for one horse and one cow" and the words " together with the right of Estovers, the right of Turbary and the right of Piscary"; I confirm the registration at Entry No. 3 with the following modification, namely, the deletion of the words "together with the right of estovers and the right of turbary"; I confirm the registration at Entry No. 4 with the following modification, namely, the deletion of the words "together with the Right of Turbary, the Right of Estovers and the Right of Herbage", I refuse to confirm the registrations at Entry Nos 5,5, and 7; and I confirm the registration at Entry No.8 with the following modification, namely, the deletion of the words "The rights of estovers and turbary".

Im Myers also informed me that it had been agreed with the applicants for the registration at Entry No 1 that I should refuse to confirm that registration, which I accordingly do.

I am required by regulation 30 (1) of the Commons Commissioners Regulations 1971 to explain that a person aggrieved by this decision as being erroneous in point of law may, within 6 weeks from the date on which notice of the decision is sent to him, require me to state a case for the decision of the High Court.
